Why do (and don't!) we fast?

We are in the middle of the Dormition Fast, a Fast that will end with the Celebration of the Blessed Lady's repose on August 28th. Why do (and don't) we fast?

- We don't fast because there is something sinful about eating meat, etc..
- We don't fast to impress God or to win His favor or to make up for other things we "miss the mark" on.
- We don't fast so that we can judge others who fast less rigorously than we do; we should keep our eyes on our own plates and base our attitudes towards our neighbors on charity, not judgment.
- On its own, fasting won't make us better people; most of us actually get grumpier when we fast... plus the devil never eats (and remains evil)!

So why bother?

- Fasting builds up the "muscle" that allows us to resist temptation. As we become better at doing well under these artificial conditions, we become better at doing well when the choices really matter.
- Fasting reinforces our commitment to something bigger than ourselves. We should fast as well as our health and circumstances allow... and remember that fasting is a practical means to a righteous end... not a righteous end by itself.

August 21st: Sunday after the Gransfiguration The Order of Worship

Blessed is the Kingdom Amen. Heaven and earth are joined in praise of God.

Great Litany. Prayers of supplication to God w/ refrain "Lord have mercy!"

Psalm 102. This sung Psalm is followed by a Small Litany ("Again and again...").

Psalm 145 & "Only Begotten Son". These are also followed by a Small Litany.

The Beatitudes. God's wisdom offered in song – beautiful consolation.

The Little Entrance/Gospel Entrance. This symbolizes Christ coming from heaven into the world. We can kiss the Gospel (an icon of "The Word") in celebration saying; "Christ is in our midst" "He is and shall be!" "Khristos Posered Nas" "I Ye I Budet"

Hymns for Today. As with all the music, everyone is encouraged to sing along!

Tone 8 Troparion (Resurrection)

You descended from on high, O Merciful One!

You accepted the three day burial to free us from our sufferings!//

O Lord, our Life and Resurrection, glory to You!

Tone 7 Troparion (*Transfiguration*)

You were transfigured on the mountain, O Christ God,

revealing Your glory to Your Disciples as far as they could bear it.

Let Your everlasting Light also shine upon us sinners,

through the prayers of the Theotokos!//

O Giver of Light, glory to You!

Tone 4 Troparion (Pokrova)

O Mother of God, sheltered by thy coming / we faithful people today keep feast in joy,/ and looking at thy most pure image, / moved to the depths of our hearts, we say:/ "Protect us with thy precious veil /and deliver us from every ill, /by entreating Christ, thy Son and our God, //to save our souls.

Tone 8 Kontakion (Resurrection)

By rising from the tomb, You raised the dead and resurrected Adam.

Eve exults in Your Resurrection,//

And the world celebrates Your rising from the dead, O greatly Merciful One!

Tone 7 Kontakion (Transfiguration)

On the mountain You were transfigured, O Christ God, and Your Disciples beheld Your glory as far as they could see it; so that when they would behold You crucified, they would understand that Your suffering was voluntary, and would proclaim to the world// that You are truly the Radiance of the Father.

Tone 2 Kondak (for the Pokrova/Temple)

The mystery hidden from eternity / and unknown to the angels, / is manifested to those on earth through you, Theotokos! / God being incarnate of you by union without confusion / and of His Own will freely enduring the Cross for us / and raising the first-formed man, // has saved our souls from death!

Trisagion: We join the angels in proclaiming God's glory (Holy God, Holy Immortal...)!

Prokeimenon, Tone 8 (Resurrection; Psalm 75:11,1)

Pray and make your vows before the Lord, our God!

v: In Judah God is known; His name is great in Israel.

Prokeimenon, Tone 4 (Transfiguration; Psalm 103:24)

O Lord, how manifold are Your works; in wisdom have You made them all!

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 3:9-17

Alleluia, Alleluia! (Psalms 94:1,2; 88:11)

v: Come, let us rejoice in the Lord! Let us make a joyful noise to God our Savior!

v: Let us come before His face with thanksgiving; let us make a

joyful noise to Him with songs of praise!

v: The heavens are Yours; the earth also is Yours.

Gospel: Matthew 14: 22-34. Children are encouraged to come up front; "Let the little children come unto me." (Matthew 19:14)

Litanies for the Faithful and for the Catachumens. Catachumens are Christians preparing to enter into the Mysteries of the Orthodox Church.

Cherubic Hymn. We "put aside all earthly cares" and join the angels in worship.

The Great Entrance. This ritual reminds us of Palm Sunday... and the Passion of Christ. The children are welcome and encouraged to line the aisle.

Commemoration of the Last Supper and Consecration of the Gifts. This is when the Holy Spirit comes down and changes the gifts. Please kneel or stand (either is fine).

Hymn to the Birthgiver of God, Mary. Magnify, O my soul, the Lord Who was transfigured on Mount Tabor! Your childbearing was without corruption; God came forth from your body clothed in flesh, and appeared on earth and dwelt among men. Therefore we all magnify you, O Theotokos.

Litany of Preparation. Lord's Prayer. Please join us as pray together using the words Jesus the Messiah taught us during His earthly ministry.

"Holy Things for the Holy". We enter into the greatest Mystery of Communion.

Communion of the Faithful. Communion is reserved for those who are members of an Orthodox parish and have prepared themselves through prayer, fasting, and regular confession. See Fr. Anthony if you would like to learn more about joining this parish!

Post-Communion Prayers, Dismissal & Distribution of the Antidoron. Everyone can come forward, kiss the cross, and receive some homemade blessed bread.

Goday's Scripture Readings

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 3:9-17 (The Three Little Pigs metaphor for life)

For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, you are God's building. According to the grace of God which was given to me, as a wise master builder I have laid the foundation, and another builds on it. But let each one take heed how he builds on it. For no other foundation can anyone lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ. Now if anyone builds on this foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, straw, each one's work will become clear; for the Day will declare it, because it will be revealed by fire; and the fire will test each one's work, of what sort it is. If anyone's work which he has built on it endures, he will receive a reward. If anyone's work is burned, he will suffer loss; but he himself will be saved, yet so as through fire.

Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him. For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-34

Immediately Jesus made His disciples get into the boat and go before Him to the other side, while He sent the multitudes away. And when He had sent the multitudes away, He went up on the mountain by Himself to pray. Now when evening came, He was alone there. But the boat was now in the middle of the sea, tossed by the waves, for the wind was contrary.

Now in the fourth watch of the night Jesus went to them, walking on the sea. And when the disciples saw Him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, "It is a ghost!" And they cried out for fear.

But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Be of good cheer! It is I; do not be afraid."

And Peter answered Him and said, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water."

So He said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous,[b] he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out, saying, "Lord, save me!"

And immediately Jesus stretched out His hand and caught him, and said to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased.

Then those who were in the boat came and worshiped Him, saying, "Truly You are the Son of God."

When they had crossed over, they came to the land of Gennesaret.
